• Carl J. Megel Special Education Scholarship - Honoring AFT President Emeritus IFT educators have a unique opportunity to help special education students pursue higher education or career training by sponsoring them for this Special Education Scholarship.

The IFT will award one \$20,000 Megel scholarship (\$5,000 each year for four years) to a deserving high school senior who is enrolled in a special education school, class, or program for students with disabilities.

Applicants must be high school seniors who will graduate in 2024.

IFT members who work directly with (or previously worked with) an eligible student must provide a letter of sponsorship for the applicant. (Children of IFT members may also apply)

This AFT Program offers four 4-year, \$8,000 post-secondary scholarships to students who are dependents of AFT members, as well as 10 one-time \$1,000 grants to AFT members to assist with their continuing education and/or fund their proposed ideas to strengthen and grow their union.

Each year the Southwest Suburban Federation of Teachers, AFT Local 943, awards two scholarships in the amount of two-thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) each

The applicant must be the child of a currently employed, active member in good standing of Local 943; or the child of a member of Local 943's retiree chapter; or the child of a deceased member who was in good standing at the time of death.

The applicant must be a member of a public high school graduation class and enrolling in a public college or university (including community colleges).

Selection will be made on the basis of five criteria listed below:

- 1. official scores on the ACT/SAT entrance examinations
- 2. class rank, and GPA (1st semester of senior year)
- 3. record of extra-curricular activities and community service
- 4. two (2) letters of reference by members of the staff of the student's high school where he/she is currently enrolled
- 5. a 100-word essay which details future aspirations.

The turbulent political environment can cause us to experience awkward confrontations and uncomfortable conversations with friends, family and co-workers. So how to we survive election year? Don't say "move to Canada", suppress your views, or surrender to "voter abstention"!

Finally, be an informed voter! Learn about pro-public education candidates vetted by your union. Print a copy of this <u>List of Endorsements from the Illinois Federation of Teachers</u> and take it with you when you go to vote in the Illinois Primary Election on March 19th. It is crucial to remember that staying positive during an election is not only beneficial for our mental and emotional well-being but also for the overall health of our society. So be sure you get out to vote NO MATTER WHAT!

The Tax Man Cometh!

The first quarter of the year can bring feelings of elation or dread as we contemplate the April 15th tax deadline. Though this two-month deadline may seem, to some, eons away, it will be here before you know it.

As I was researching information for this article, I discovered a huge surprise! The following unreimbursed employee expenses have not been deductible since 2018 and through 2025, even if you itemize:

- Union dues
- travel to Union Senate meetings
- travel to educational workshops
- out-of-pocket expenses for classroom purchases

The AFT is part of a group of unions fighting to reinstate these deductions. Be sure to do your own research and/or check with your tax professional to ensure that you are best positioned when filing your 2023 tax return.

Legislative Update

A Plan Time Bill

State Senator Meg Loughran Cappel (D-Shorewood) introduced a bill to provide 45 minutes of continuous plan time for all public school teachers. As currently written, the bill would guarantee that educators may not be forced to substitute in other areas of the building or district when another educator is absent or a vacancy exists and may not be forced to attend meetings, trainings, or conferences of any kind. If an educator chooses to substitute or attend a meeting, training, or conference during their guaranteed planning period of their own free will, the educator shall be compensated at a rate of pay that is negotiated between the Union and the administration. If signed, the law would go into effect on Jan 1, 2025. To track this bill through the legislative process, click here.
